ANOTHER WAY The Dao of Artist Development

Julia Cameron's THE ARTIST'S WAY has gone unrivaled since its first publication in 1992, selling millions of copies to this day. It continues to be the primary resource for artists struggling with careers in the Arts.

It's time now for ANOTHER WAY.

After an epic rise in the Arts, Emileena has managed to find a paradigm shift that she believes can transform the Arts, one artist at a time.

Using Joseph Campbell's Hero's Journey, artists are placed in the role of Hero and compassionately guided through a transformative process toward achieving sustainability.

Broken down into the three 'Acts,' each step in the Hero's Journey is accompanied with pop-culture references. These sections also correspond to phases in The Sustainability Cycle (Exploration, Inclusion, Evolution), a formula that Emileena suggests is the key to survival in the Arts.

> Act 1: Departure, A Sociological Study. (Exploration) Act 2: Initiation, A Psychological Study. (Inclusion) Act 3: Return, A Philosophical Study (Evolution)





Emileena Pedigo entered the NYC Arts scene producing an international theater festival, working with artists from around the world hungry to get their work into the theatre capital of the world. Emileena also general-managed for various nonprofits, assisted on Broadway, worked various film and music festivals, and managed several singer/songwriters. She toured theaters, music arenas, and schools across the country, working with artists from all artistic disciplines. After resigning from the festival to launch The Show Goes On Productions, her work began to focus on emerging trends in entertainment. There she found

herself stuck inside a self-perpetuating system of exploitation. It was a long, tough road to #ArtsMeetsBiz. That's when she recognized she was on Joseph Campbell's Hero's Journey. Deep in the "Cave" battling her "Shadow" self, Emileena witnessed many artists losing the fight. She would have been lost too if not for an excursion to an ayahuasca retreat in the Peruvian mountains. Upon her return she found the "Elixir" she feels belongs to the world: a paradigm shift that starts one artist at a time. She calls it The Sustainability Cycle (Exploration, Inclusion, Evolution). This is her art.

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- In the wake of celebrity suicides from music (Avicii), television (Anthony Bourdain), and even fashion (Kate Spade), Emileena directly addresses the social forces that are plaguing our artists and offering up #AnotherWay.
- Emileena's #AnotherWay Blog discusses artist development by dissecting the Arts psychologically, sociologically, and philosophically.
- Emileena is disrupting traditional models in search of finding #AnotherWay. Whether she is producing events, consulting creative business leaders, or incubating developing artists, Emileena uses innovative thinking to bring alternative ideas into public discourse.
- Emileena's book outlines how artists can find sustainability in the Arts by following Joseph Campbell's Hero's Journey in search of #AnotherWay.
- #ARTSMEETSBIZ: Emileena is a graduate of Purdue University, Commercial Theatre Institute, and SUNY/Kaufmann's Fasttrac program for entrepreneurs
- Emileena is an avid Daoist and considers the philosophy the only measure under which her work is consistently framed.
- Emileena co-founded the ARTSLAB Meetup, which brings together artists from every discipline to incubate solutions to the challenges facing the Arts as an industry.
- As managing producer of the Midtown International Theatre Festival in NYC for seven years, Emileena grew the festival to sixty productions in seven venues.
- Emileena is intimately aware of how venues work in NYC specifically, working with various club owners and having managed multiple rehearsal studios and venues (including Broadway). But also from multiple national tours to theatre, arenas, and schools.
